Volunteer Spotlight Doug Morris, A Champion for Second Chances



We're honored to highlight Doug Morris, a remarkable volunteer whose commitment to helping others rebuild their lives is truly inspiring. Doug, now 72, spent 35 years in prison, where he devoted himself to bettering his prison community by teaching financial literacy. Using books he purchased himself, Doug led classes on taxes, budgeting, and home ownership to help his peers prepare for life after release.



Doug's dedication extended to his involvement with the Reaching Out From Within Program, which he actively participated in throughout his time at Lansing Prison.

Since his release in 2021, Doug has seamlessly transitioned from supporting his incarcerated peers to aiding returning citizens in Kansas City. Shortly after his parole, Greg Winship, President of Reaching Out From Within, invited Doug to mentor and lead weekly support groups for residents at the Transition Center of Kansas City (TCKC). This role came naturally to Doug, who soon sought out other ways to help. He was quickly connected to Journey to New Life, where he has now volunteered as a Reentry Specialist for the past 18 months.

At Journey to New Life, Doug goes above and beyond to support clients in need. He assists with essentials such as clothing, hygiene products, and official identification. He even provides transportation to the DMV, sometimes letting clients use his car for their driving tests. Doug's dedication doesn't stop there; he's made countless special trips for clients, including a memorable journey to Springfield so one client could reunite with his mother for the first time in 17 years. Doug truly embodies the "extra mile" spirit, whether he's assisting with legal matters—such as a trip to Warrensburg to help a client avoid re-incarceration, or facilitating connections with reentry programs and housing organizations.

I am excited to share some transformative changes happening at our main office, thanks to new funding and partnerships that are allowing us to expand our services and deepen our commitment to building a supportive community.

We've seen firsthand how impactful community-building has been in our Residential Program, where shared support and connection among residents contribute significantly to their long-term success after graduation. This model of mutual encouragement, accountability, and companionship has not only strengthened our residents' resilience, but has also provided them with a foundation of lasting support. Inspired by these outcomes, we're thrilled to extend the same energy and opportunities to all of our clients.

With the generous support of SAMHSA's Building Communities of Recovery grant, which provides \$300,000 each year over the next three years, we will transform our main office into a community-centered space with extended hours. This new setup will allow us to offer additional support groups and sober social events for our clients outside the residences, helping them to build healthy, supportive networks. Through these programs, we hope to replicate the community-building success we've seen in our residences and provide every client with the opportunity for meaningful connection and stability post-release.

This transformation is also made possible by a few special donors who have helped us design our space to encourage connection and support. A special shoutout to Rick Jenson from Direct Response Services and Steve Coppinger from Impact Interiors for all you are doing to improve our space!

In addition to these changes, our Employment Services Program is growing, fueled by new support from several key partners. Funding from the Kauffman Foundation will enhance our program capacity, while KC Digital Inclusion is supporting the addition of a computer lab at our 3120 location. Support from the Hall Family Foundation will allow us to expand skill-building workshops and training sessions. Additionally, our strategic partnership with the Transformative Workforce Academy will broaden our employer network, opening up more pathways to sustainable employment for our clients.

We're excited to bring these new resources to our clients, and we are deeply grateful to our community of supporters who make this possible. Thank you for standing by our mission and helping us build a network of support that truly changes lives.
